Lunches

Please can we remind everyone to send in healthy snacks and packed lunches for children. It is vital that children are eating nutritious snacks and packed lunches at school. This will help children to stay fit and healthy; focus in lessons and thrive socially and emotionally. May we also remind you that we are a nut-free school. If you would like any further advice or ideas for healthy packed lunches, please do not hesitate to contact the school. If your child has a school lunch, please make payments through ParentPay. *Meals cost £2.30 per day or £11.50 per week*.

If children are wanting to change from dinners to packed lunches or vice versa, the office require half a term notice please as food orders are placed in advance. Thank you.

We are aware that home circumstances change. If this happens school are able check to see if your child is entitled to free school meals. All that is required is your national insurance number and the date of birth of the parent. If you think this might be the case, please nip into the office and we can apply for you. If your child is entitled then they will receive this for the next 6 years.

Uniform



As we are heading towards the end of the summer term, please bear in mind that the clothing companies get busy with orders for the up and coming year, so please make sure you order your uniform in advance if you require it for the beginning of

We have noticed a number of children coming to school in unsuitable footwear, school policy stipulates black shoes or plain black trainers (not white or any other colours). If you need any support with uniform please see Miss Tully or Mrs Padgett, who will be happy to help.

Please could you check, children should not be coming to school wearing jewelry, this is for their safety. We will be asking children to remove these items in school. Please leave bracelets and earring at home.

On-Line Safety - Phones

More recently we are having to deal with issues from outside of school with children being unkind to each other on social media. We are aware that a lot of the apps children use now have an age limit above primary school children. If as a parent your child is using them it is important that they know how to conduct themselves and stay safe. We constantly address this in school, supporting all children in understanding their presence on social media and the affects it can have on others.

How to start a conversation with your child about using a phone safely:

Why do you want to get a phone?

Whilst deciding if it is time for your child to have their first phone can be a great opportunity to find out what your child expects to use their phone for. This could be for connecting with friends, playing games, for keeping in touch whilst out of the house or other reasons.

What do you like about using your phone?

You can ask your child about their favourite apps or games, what they like using their phone for, or you can ask them to show you how to play or use their favourite game or website.

What would you do if something worrying or upsetting happened on your phone?

You can ask them about the places they can go to find the safety advice, find out what they know about privacy settings, and ask them how to report or block on the services they use.

How can we do more online together?

Ask your child about activities or games that you could enjoy as a family, this can be a great time to establish a <u>family agreement</u> to manage your families time online.

Top tips

Talk with your child about responsible use of their phone

Discuss what is okay and not okay to use their phone for. Talk about time limits and expectations of where the device can and cannot be used, this could include things like the phone being charged outside their bedroom overnight.

Discuss what to do if something upsetting or worrying happens

Give them the strategies they need in case something concerning happens whilst they are using their device. This could be to lock the screen and tell an adult, to make a report to the platform they are using, or to block the user.

Explore parental controls

Take a look at the controls available both on the phone itself and on your home Wi-Fi. Talk these through with your child too. Parental controls are a helpful tool, but an open conversation with your child is the most important thing.

Stay and Play Sessions






